Welcome to our first Eco/School Council Newsletter for 2014!

The ECO team and the School Council have joined forces (name to be decided) and one of our goals is to achieve the Green Flag. We already have our Bronze Certificate (Step 1) and are in the process of applying for our Silver Certificate (Step 2). Once we get our Silver we can start working towards our Green Flag (Step 3).

We have been busy over the past year within school. Eco projects last year included:

- Building and implementing 7 raised beds for Years 1 & 2
 Last year they planted strawberries, herbs and flowers. They learnt about how things grow and how we must tend to them. This of course included weeding not everyone's favourite!
- Purchasing and feeding 2 Wormeries for Year 3
 After some worms decided they wanted to escape, we got to grips with caring for the worms and they are now happily producing black gold/compost for our raised beds. These worms reuse organic waste from year 3 break/lunchtime snacks reducing our waste output.
- Continuing to expand our Mini Beast Hotel

 The hotel is up and running but we need to spend some time modernising the facility and upgrading it to a 5* status!
- Planting and potting 50 trees donated from the Woodland Trust
 They are flourishing in our Eco Garden and we are looking to plant them on school grounds as possible hedging around our new outdoor classroom (situated at the side of the canteen).
- Partnerships

Last year we worked with Ulster Wildlife Foundation learning about how we as a school can become more ECO friendly. Other partnerships developed included Tesco, HSBC, Wrigley's and Belfast City Council. We hope to continue these relationships with many more exciting new projects.
